Overview

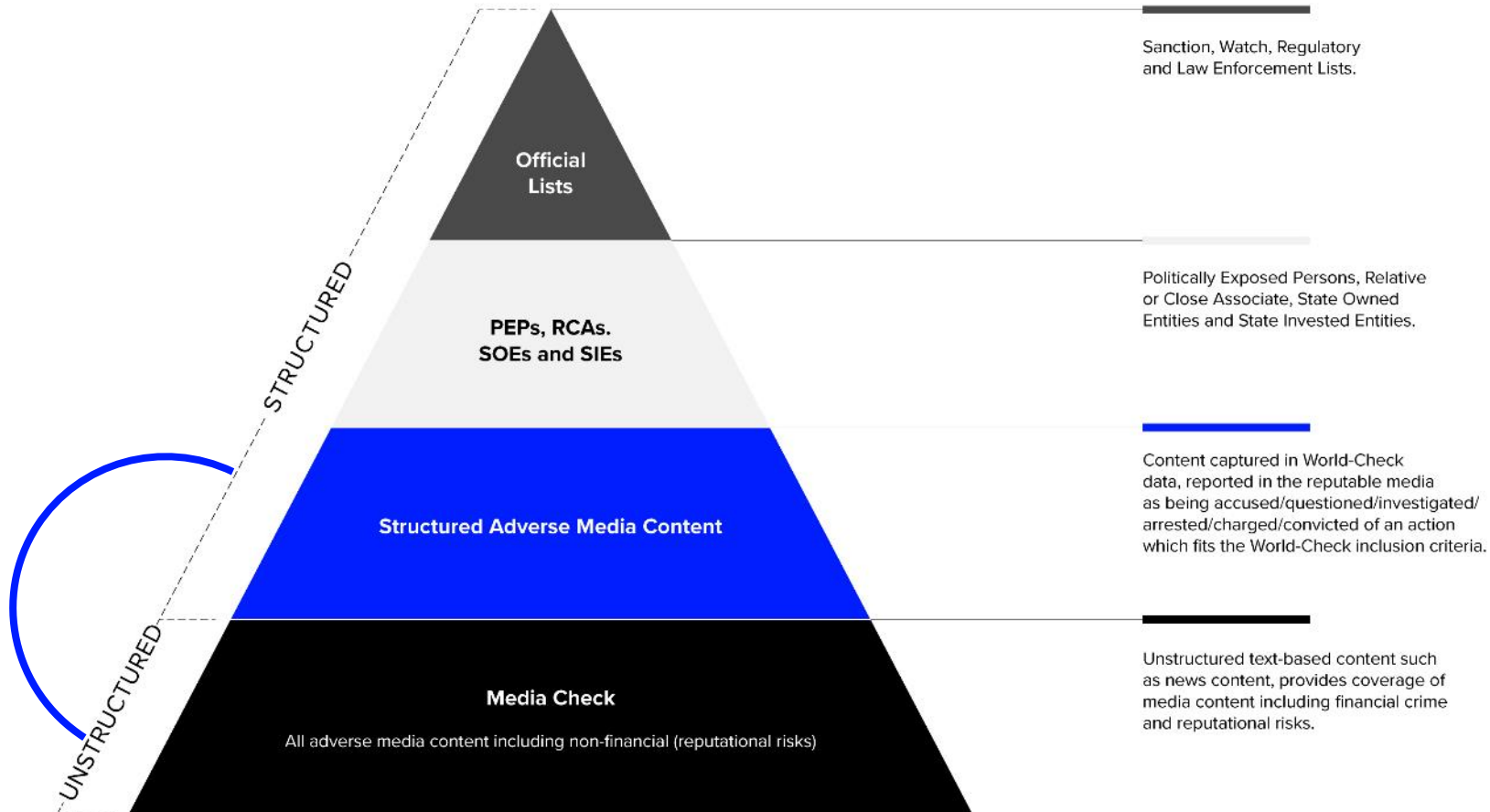

The Categorisation Challenge

Pre-Conviction Categories

Individuals who are investigated, accused, arrested, charged, questioned, detained etc., remain categorised as **INDIVIDUAL** until conviction.

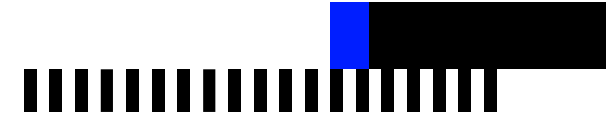
Organisations or Corporates remain **ORGANISATION** or **CORPORATE**.

Post Conviction /pleading guilty Categories

- CRIME – NARCOTICS
- CRIME – ORGANISED
- CRIME – WAR
- CRIME – FINANCIAL
- CRIME – TERRORISM
- CRIME – OTHER

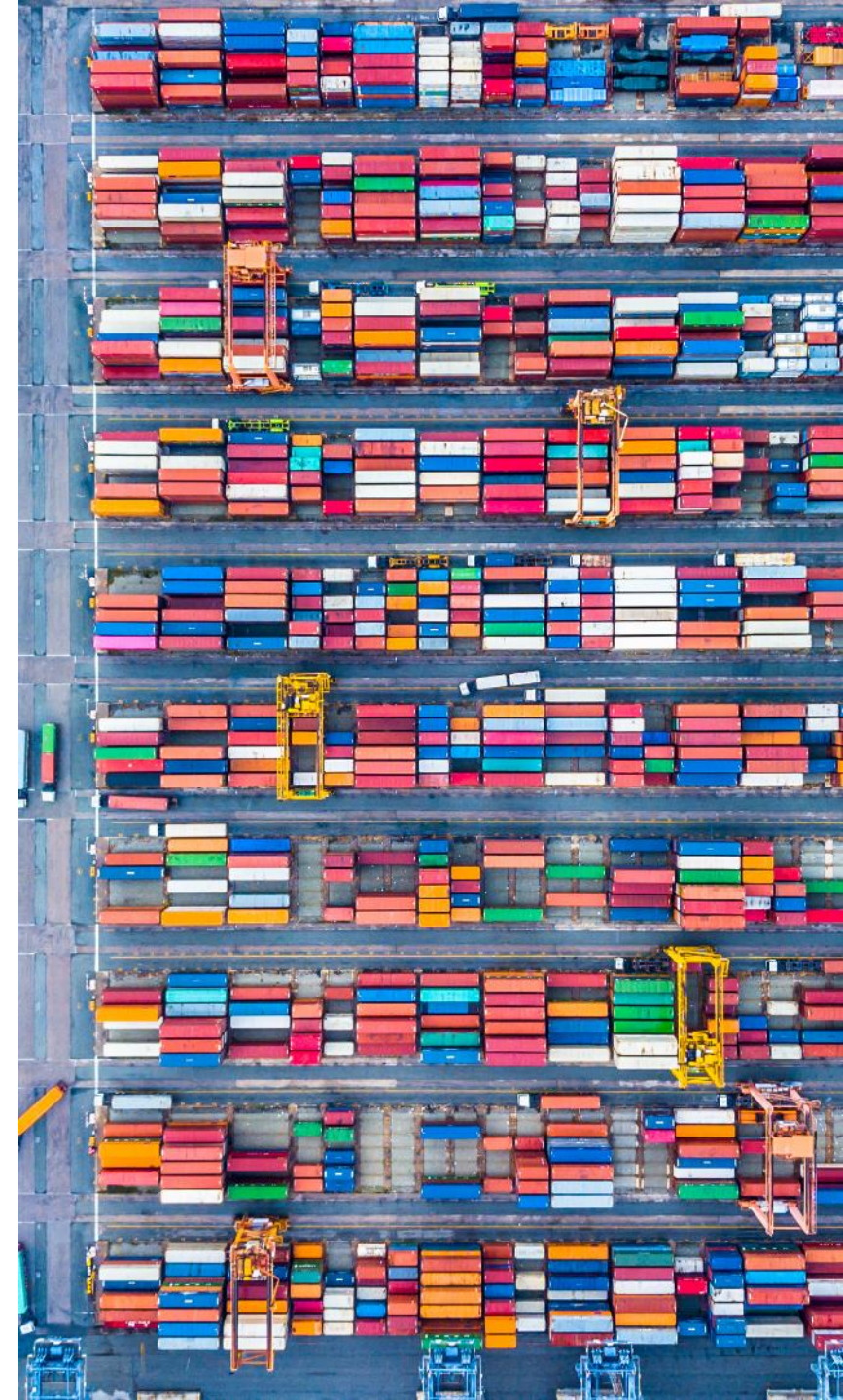

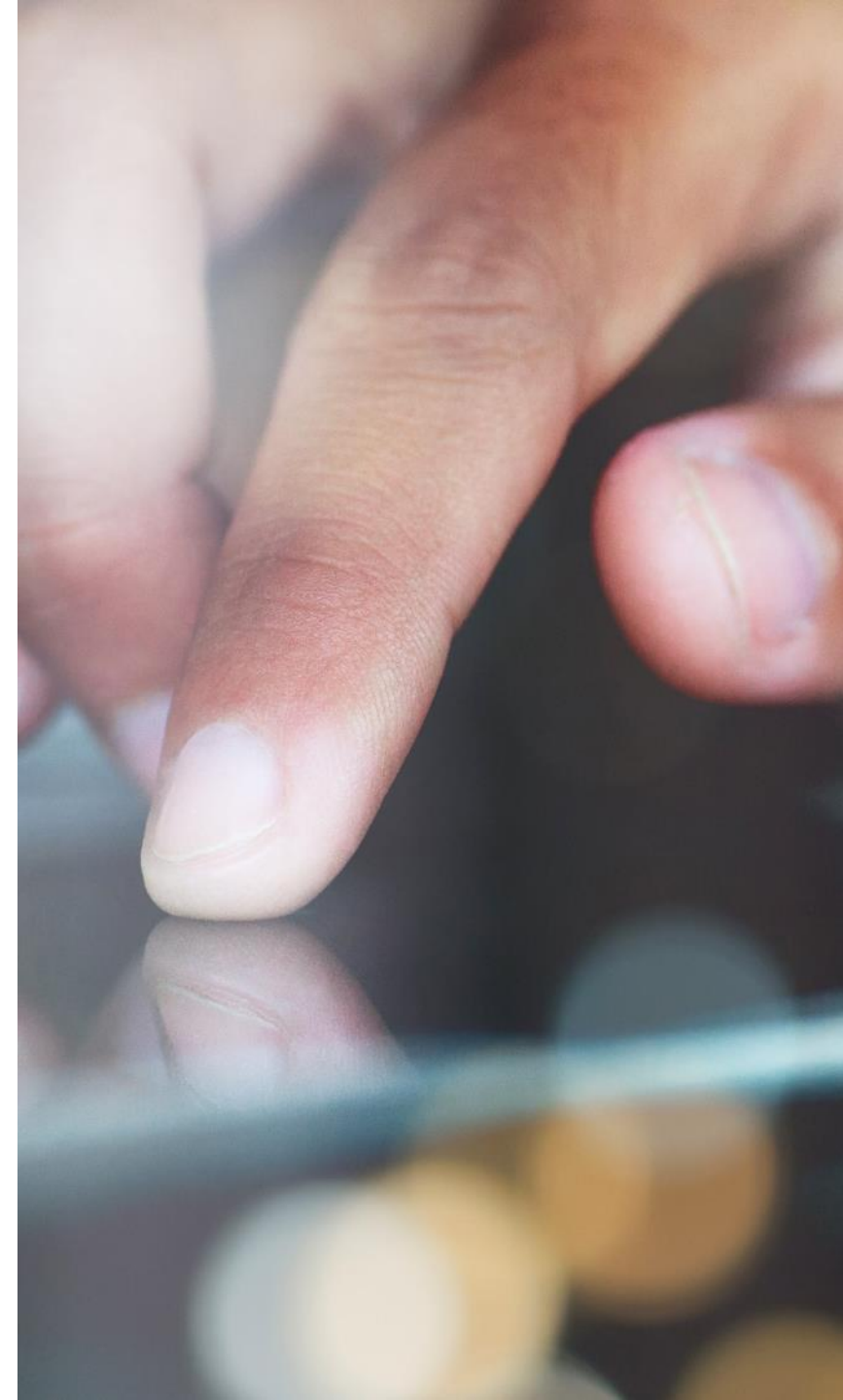
The **Special Interest Categories** point to the reasons for the inclusion of the Individual or Entity on the World-Check database.

The Special Interest Categories provide you with a clear indication of the potential risk associated to the Pre and Post Conviction records included on the World-Check Database.

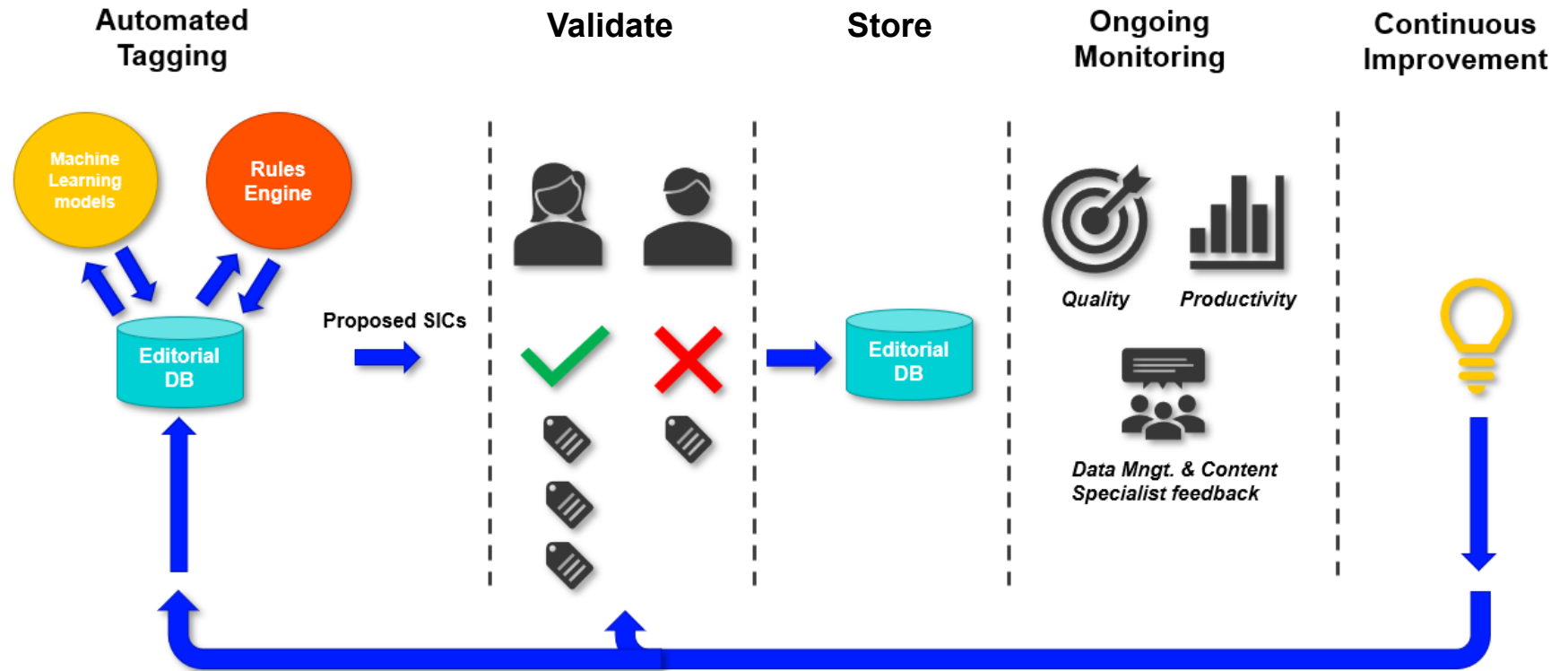
Records returned in your results have a clear label – dependent on the delivery method you use – and additionally details of the specific special interest category or categories associated to that record.

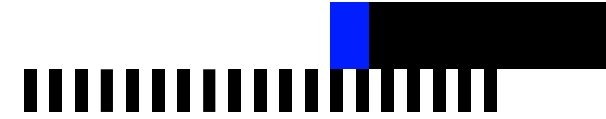


Special Interest Categories

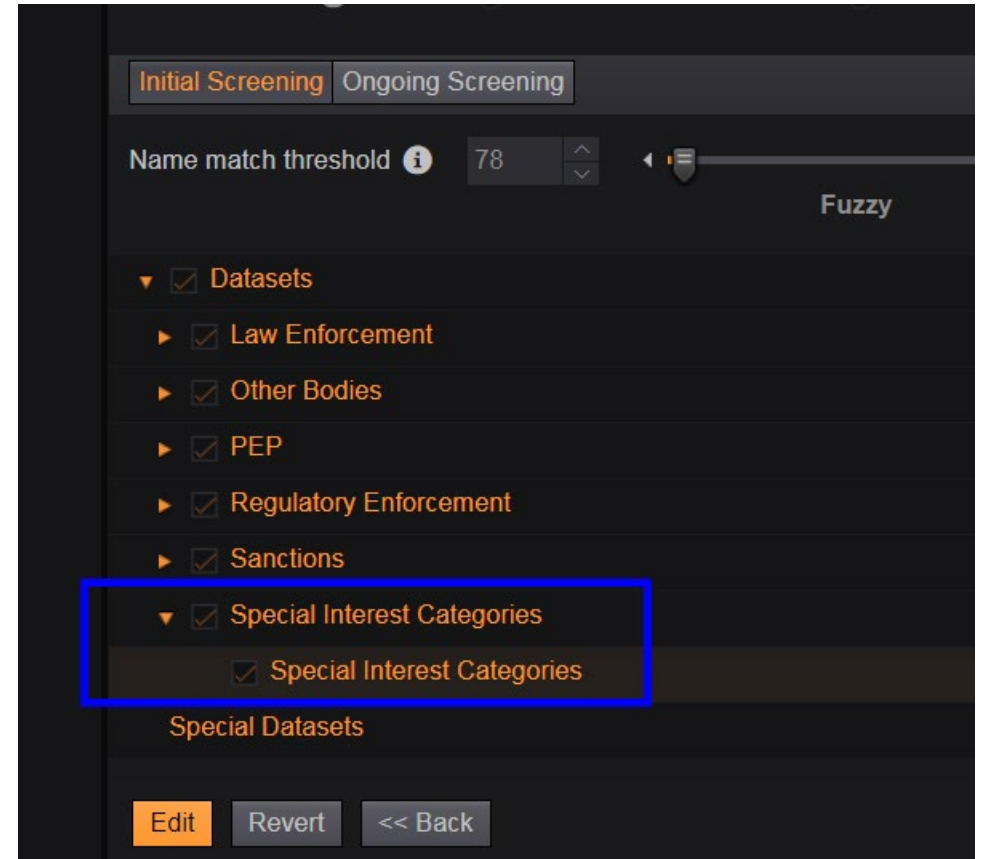

Working with the World-Check One Desktop

The Special Interest Categories feature is incorporated into World-Check One as an additional [Dataset](#). You can select the Special Interest Categories you wish to include in your screening universe.**

When setting up your screening filters for example you can choose to exclude PEPs as a Dataset but include relevant Special Interest Categories. Should a PEP be tagged with any of the Special Interest Categories* chosen in your initial screening selection they will be returned in the results.

Working with the World-Check One API

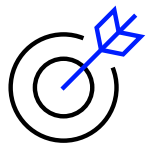
